INTRODUCTION

The International Network of Museums for Peace (INMP) was established at the first international conference of peace museums held at the University of Bradford (UK) in September 1992. From May 1993 (No. 1) until October 2002 (No. 15), an occasional newsletter was published under the auspices of the *Give Peace a Chance* charitable trust in the UK.

Following the incorporation of INMP as a foundation in The Hague (Netherlands) and the opening of a secretariat in the same city, publication of the newsletter was resumed in May 2011. Initially published twice a year, from 2015 the newsletter was published quarterly.

More information about the history of INMP, and the newsletter, can be found in a special issue (No. 18, March 2017), celebrating the 25th anniversary of INMP, and in the 'Message from the Retiring Editor-in-Chief' (No. 35, June 2021). The newsletters are available on the INMP webpage at <u>https://inmp.net/INMP_Newsletter.aspx</u>

The index concerns the 35 issues published in the decade from May 2011 until June 2021 and consists of two parts. The first and longest part comprises content pages of each issue. This is followed by several indexes of names and subjects – such as of authors and museums – which greatly facilitate searching for information. Names of entries are followed by issue number (and page number).

Most of the indexing work was undertaken by Annika Wallengren, a volunteer at the Bertha von Suttner Peace Institute in The Hague (2020-2021). The work was supervised and edited by Petra Keppler and Peter van den Dungen of the same institute.
