## HOW TO BECOME A MEMBER

If your museum, institution or related program can be described as a Museum for Peace, then you can become an Institutional member of INMP. Institutional members receive recognition of your museum/organisation in INMP publications, website, and social media, and have opportunities to host or organise INMP-sponsored events and conferences. The annual Institutional Member Fee\* is ¥12,500 (Japanese Yen) - approximately €72 or US\$85. 6

We welcome the support of individual members. Individual Membership in INMP is open to anyone interested in supporting museums for peace and their work together. Members include students and young people, artists, writers and journalists, teachers, museum professionals, civic and community leaders, and peace, human rights, and environmental advocates. The annual Individual Member Fee\* is ¥2,500 (Japanese Yen) - approximately €14.50 or US\$17.
